Jesus Test For "Wanna-Be" Disciples

-December 2024-Luke 14:26-35

Let's study verse by verse...

Vs. 26 first, hate all people, even ones we love the most. Luke 12:49-59,



Matt.10:34-39 and 18:23-35 shows that Jesus predestined this. At least, to love HIM, more than anyone else. Luke 15:11-24 adds to the suspense. It details a prodigal son asking for his father's inheritance early and wasting it in the dark life's nature until God brought him to his senses per Rom. 8:16-21 and Mark 16:15-16! Believers still hate the "remnants of Adam" that remain in us and others.

Vs. 27 demands we carry our own cross. Jesus means for us to carry it's <u>message</u> which will bring persecution as it did Him per 1 Corinthians 4:9-13 and 2 Thessalonians 1:1-10

Vs's. 28-32 challenges us to weigh the cost of reaching God's "tower," <u>any</u> other way. Matt. 18:24 says our sin debt would require us 150,000 years to pay, subject to ridicule on judgement day, if we don't ask God for terms of peace per Luke 18:9-14, 1 John 1:7-9 and John 14:6.


Vs. 33 says the first negotiable point for peace is to give up <u>all</u> our possessions! The farm, our family, money, career and our talents that gain pleasure or prestige? No. What is only <u>ours</u> that isn't a gift from God? Our sins! God wants to trade them for Jesus and His unconditional love, righteousness, forgiveness and life when we trust His blood to cleanse us from <u>all</u> our sins.1 John 1:7 says the "light" comes on to show us what God has done. It's called the "exchanged life" when our life of Adam's darkness is traded for Christ's Life of Light and joy.

Vs's. 34-35 Jesus uses what our physical eyes can see so our hearts understand what His spiritual words are pointing to. In Mark 2:1-12 a paralytic was lowered thru the roof. Jesus, seeing their faith, declared his sins forgiven. It angered the scribes so He said (if I'm God's Son) which is easier to say, "your sins are forgiven or "take up your mat and walk." He spoke, the man walked and the crowd was amazed!

2 Chronicles 13:5 says God made an irrevocable covenant of salt with David, and descendants, as a metaphor for it's eternal commitment of loyalty for man's sin purification.. 2 Chronicles 13:5 says don't we know God gave rule forever to David and his "sons" by a covenant of <u>salt</u>. Jesus is called the SON of David in the Psalms. Leviticus 2:13 (KJV) writes that every meat offering, as well as all offerings, you shall offer salt. Man learned that salt was the best cure to preserve flesh for a limited time, as Moses covenant of animal blood covered sin until Jesus.

Jesus is pointing to His blood as "salt" being the only agent that preserves souls forever with Him. It's good, but only when we carry its message to the world. If this good news becomes tasteless, preaching is useless for disciples to sow in the soil where people are hungry for truth, and no uses for those already headed for the manure pile. Don't miss Jesus' warning. When His blood gets too boring to preach, those churches will be overcome by Satan and his manure pile.












The "Last Word" I have for you in this letter is *gratitude*. Pastor James MacDonald often would say that "Gratitude is the attitude that sets the altitude for living". I firmly believe that this saying is true in both our natural and in our spiritual living. If we gratefully recognize what God has truly done for us through giving us His only son to forgive us of and rescue us from our sins (John 3:16), then that changes our whole perspective and attitude on life. When we realize that God spent His most precious possession to purchase our redemption, that should change our view of our own worth in God's eyes. When we read in Genesis that we are each made in the image of God, we should recognize the value of others according to God's perspective. Realizing we all are made in the *imago dei* (image of God) should cause us to be more patient and grateful toward and with each other. If in the natural we express that gratitude by living a life of obeying the commands to love Him, love our neighbors, and love each other, we will be gaining altitude in the spiritual.

This world offers many "shiny objects" that are tantalizing and often serve to distract us from the Creator and instead fixated on created things. This seems even more troublesome at Christmas where thoughts of gift shopping and parties and decorating take a great deal of our attention. It is my prayer that each of us will not lose sight of what this Advent season is supposed to be about...the grateful, expectant, hopeful, anticipation of the 1st coming of Messiah. May we never lose our gratitude of God sending His son to walk amongst us, teach us what heaven is like, and be the Waymaker for us all in His life and through His death and resurrection.

May we also not get so hung up on the seasonal traditions and trappings that we fail to realize that we are in a "new" Advent season of the church age. We are now expectantly waiting on the 2nd appearing and coming of Jesus Messiah! We should be grateful that Jesus is not still the helpless baby in the manger, nor dying nailed to a tree, nor dead in a tomb, but grateful that He is alive and well at the right hand of the Father, and returning in all of His glory for us... and soon.

I hope that if you give gifts at Christmas that you are grateful for the ones that others graciously give you. But in this Advent season I hope that we can all be grateful for the unmatchable gifts that only the Father can provide: the living HOPE of Jesus Christ (1 Peter 1:3), the PEACE that passes all understanding (Phil 4:7), the unspeakable JOY He gives (1 Peter 1:8), and the unconditional LOVE (1 John 3:1) of the Father.

So, if you are feeling like you are at a low altitude today, and in danger of hitting that mountain in front of you, turn your eyes back to God, and let the gratitude for what He has already done for you take you to that higher altitude, into clearer air, and brighter skies, higher than the storms, troubles, and turbulence of life can reach.






